

Evaluating Book Resources

Find a book record in the Library Catalog. Different sections of the book record can tell you a lot about a book even before you track it down on the shelves. Make sure to look closely at all the sections, including the notes, description and subjects.

Book Citation

Authority / Expertise

1. Who's the author, organization or sponsor behind it?
2. What can you tell about their credentials? *Tip: have they written other books on this subject?*

Content, Scope, Authenticity

1. What is the date of publication?
2. Is there a bibliography?
3. How detailed or in-depth is it? *Tip: how long is it?*
4. What are the subjects for this book?

Availability

1. Is this book available for check out?
2. What is the Call Number and location?
